

The overall trend shows an increase of population aged 65 and older. The most remarkable increase of elderly people takes place in the Czech and Slovak areas of the Centrope region with an average increase rate of 4.6 percentage points whereas the Centrope region's average increase is 2.7 percentage points. The west of Lower Austria, Vienna, and the Hungarian part of Centrope have several municipalities showing a decrease of population aged 65+.
